

## **Placement of Officials for Swim Alberta Designated Competitions**

The placement of advisory referees, referees, associate referees, starters, and those requiring evaluations will always be done in a way to ensure a technically proficient meet that allows for the highest level of performance by the swimmer.

Swim Alberta Designated Competitions include the following:

- Swim Alberta Cup
- Swim Alberta Spring Championships
- Swim Alberta Summer Championships
- Swim Alberta Provincials SC (North and South)
- Swim Alberta Provincials LC (North and South)

## **Placement of Advisory Referees for Swim Alberta Championship Competitions**

Swim Alberta will place the “Advisory Referee” for all Swim Alberta Championship and Provincial Competitions. Advisory Referees must be a Level 5 Master Official and be active in officiating at both the provincial and national level. They should have the following qualifications and experiences:

- Previous experience in the role of Advisory Referee for club hosted meets.
- Experience working different types of meets – development, age group and senior level championships.
- Experience working with different clubs in different pool settings where possible.
- Strong mentorship skills
- Technically proficient in understanding the rules and working of the pool deck during a meet.

Swim Alberta will communicate out to potential Advisory Referees advising them of the opportunity. A host club recommendation for an advisory referee will be considered, however Swim Alberta at its sole discretion has the authority to appoint advisory referees for Swim Alberta Championship Competitions.

The Alberta Officials Committee Chair, Swim Alberta Executive Director or their designate and one other Level 5 Master Official will form a committee that selects all Advisory referees. At its sole discretion, Swim Alberta may directly appoint an Advisory Referee.

Advisory Referees will be used for Swim Alberta Championship and Provincial Competitions. (Swim Alberta Cup, Swim Alberta Championships (Spring and Summer) and Swim Alberta Provincials North/South; SC/LC). In choosing the Advisory Referee, the committee looks at the placement of advisory referees from a provincial perspective to ensure opportunities for development are provided to not only the advisory referees, but other officials that will be working or assigned positions at provincial competitions.

**Placement of Referees and Starters for Swim Alberta Designated Competitions:**

Swim Alberta, through its designated Provincial Officials Committee, will approve all referees and starters for the Swim Alberta Cup, Swim Alberta Championships (Spring and Summer) and Swim Alberta Provincials (North/South; SC/LC).

In the case of the Swim Alberta Cup and the Swim Alberta Championships, the meet manager will work with the Advisory Referee in identifying referees and starters for the competitions.

The meet manager will submit a referee/starter roster to the Swim Alberta Technical Coordinator three – four (3 – 4) weeks prior to the competition. The Swim Alberta Technical Coordinator will then forward the roster to the Chair of Officials for Alberta.

*Guidelines for Placement of Referees and Starters:*

- Starters should be experienced and not new to “starting”
- Referees should in most cases be a level 4 active official
- Referees should be placed for only one day of a provincial meet wherever possible. This helps ensure the development of other referees and also ensures a fair competition for our athletes.
- In the case of a heats and finals competitions, such as the Swim Alberta Cup or the Swim Alberta Championships, the Referee and Starter must work both prelims and finals of the same day. They cannot just work either prelims or finals. If two pools are running for prelims one Referee and Starter should be placed at each pool. They will then work together at finals. If just one pool is running at prelims, two Referees/Starters can be identified - one for boys and one for girls.
- Swim Alberta will support the Local Host Club in identifying potential referees if needed.

Swim Alberta, through the designated Provincial Officials Committee, may choose to place one or two referees requiring their second evaluation at a provincial meet in order to obtain their level 4 Certification. In addition, Swim Alberta through its designated Provincial Officials Committee may work with the Meet Manager to place Associate Referees to provide them with experience and mentorship at a Swim Alberta championships meet. An Associate Referee is a developing referee who has completed their first evaluation but is not yet ready for a second evaluation. Associate Referees *will not* be assigned during Swim Alberta Provincials (North/South; SC/LC).

Referees requiring evaluations and Associate Referees should communicate directly with the Chair of the Provincial Officials Committee their request for either an evaluation or associate referee placement at least 6 weeks from the date of competition. The Chair of the Provincial Officials Committee, upon consultation with the designated provincial official’s committee, will communicate to the Meet Manager and/or Advisory Referee any evaluation or associate referees.
