Their commitment and focus on delivering results is key to the success of our organization.

This season has seen the board working with you the members to review and update our Mission, Vision and to realign our Strategic Directions and create our Values. This process included consultation with swimmers, coaches, parents, sponsors and other swimming bodies.

Mission: Swim Alberta will institute and maintain the best and most progressive development and high performance competitive programme in the world.

Vision: Alberta, leading the World in Swimming.

Values: Excellence, Integrity, Innovation, Collaboration

Strategic Directions: Athlete Development, Coach Development, Club

Development, Volunteer Development and Advocacy

The board also initiated a review of our policy and procedures to ensure that they represent current best practice and they continue to remain relevant in today's environment. This season the board approved new or updated policies in the following areas: Appeals, Associations, Behavior, Code of Conduct, Confidentiality, and Discipline & Complaints.

The performance of Alberta swimmers in the water this year was excellent, reflecting what I believe is an overall increase in the depth and strength of our club programs. Our swimmers broke 175 individual Provincial Records, 9 National Age Group Records, 15 National Senior Records and 3 Commonwealth Records. Additionally Alberta Clubs broke 6 National Age Group Relay Records, 6 National Senior Relay Records and 35 Provincial Relay Records. The swimmers who broke the records represented 11 different clubs or associations in the province.

Alberta clubs achieved success with the U of C Dino women winning the CIS title, the Cascade Swim Club winning Age Group Nationals the over all title and the men's title and the Olympian Swim Club winning the women's title at the Age Group Nationals.



Congratulations to all our programs on this year's success. Let us build on that success for even better performances next year.

Swim Alberta has been moving forward on a number of initiatives throughout the season with the aim of improving the opportunities for our swimmers, clubs and coaches. The board is continuing to work with both the staff and our partners at Swimming Canada to try and ensure a fair and level playing field is available for all.

Swim Alberta is pleased to have started to deliver the new coaching education programming in the Canada.

Fundamentals Coach - working at the introduction level of the sport Skills Coach - working at the intro competitive level to provincials Competition Coach - working with provincial level and higher

Also in the coaching area, Swim Alberta and the Canadian Swimming Coaches and Teachers Association have joined forces to create a new registration system that allows coaches to do almost all their registrations in one place. The CSCTA registration automatically ads our Alberta Coaches Council membership when the coach selects their club, and coaches can also purchase memberships at a recued rate for the Coaches of Canada, ASCA and WISCA. This one stop shop is now also added to our new online Police And Vulnerable Sector checks, which are being completed online.

The Staff at Swim Alberta continue to work with the Board of directors and the sub committees to advance our sport. This season the membership and the Board of Directors revisited our Mission, Vision, Values and Strategic Directions and this will better help the office to align our Business Plan and our Strategic Plan.



One of the biggest consumers of time this past season was the ever present debate around high performance swim suits and I am please to be able to report to the membership that as of September 1, 2009 the sport will be returning to non-coated suits that with no zippers or fasteners. For the complete rule please check the Swim Alberta website. This move will help standardize the sport once again and we will be able to focus on the abilities of the swimmers and their training and not on the external technology of a suit.

There are many other highlights in the individual reports that outline the successes of the swimmer, coaches, officials and programs of the province.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Board and the Staff for their continued commitment to the province.

AUDITORS' REPORT

To the Members of Swim Alberta Association

We have audited the statement of financial position of Swim Alberta Association (the "Association") as at June 30, 2009 and the statements of operations, changes in net assets and cash flows for the year then ended. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Association's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

Except as explained in the following paragraph, we conducted our audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we plan and perform an audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation.

In common with many charitable organizations, the Association derives revenue from donations, the completeness of which is not susceptible to satisfactory audit verification. Accordingly, our verification of these revenues was limited to the amounts recorded in the records of the Association and we were not able to determine whether any adjustments might be necessary to revenue from donations and Swim-A-Thon, excess of revenue over expenses, assets and net assets.

in our opinion, except for the effect of adjustments, if any, which we might have determined to be necessary had we been able to satisfy ourselves concerning the completeness of the revenue referred to in the preceding paragraph, these financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Association as at June 30, 2009 and the results of its operations and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles.

Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming an opinion on the basic financial statements taken as a whole. The supplementary information included in Schedule 2 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the basic financial statements. Such supplementary information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and, in our opinion, is fairly stated, in all material respects, to the basic financial statements taken as a whole.

Notes to Financial Statements

Year ended June 30, 2009

Swim Alberta Association (the "Association") is a not-for-profit organization incorporated under the Societies Act of Alberta. Its primary activity is to promote amateur swimming in Alberta. The Association is exempt from income taxes under Section 149(1) of the income Tax Act.

Significant accounting policies:

(a) Financial instruments:

Financial assets and financial liabilities classified as held-for-trading are measured at fair value on trade date, with changes in those fair values recognized in the statement of operations. Financial assets classified as held-to-maturity, loans and receivables, or other financial liabilities are measured at amortized cost using the effective interest method. Available-for-sale financial assets are measured at fair value with changes in those fair values recorded in unrestricted net assets until realized, at which time the cumulative change is recognized in the statement of operations.

Transaction costs are recognized immediately in the statement of operations. Financial instruments are recorded on a trade date basis.

The Association has adopted the following classifications:

- Cash and term deposits are classified as held-for-trading.
- Accounts receivable and loan receivable are classified as loans and receivables.
- Accounts payable and accrued liabilities are classified as other financial liabilities.

The Association does not invest in or use derivative financial instruments. Derivatives may be embedded in other financial instruments (the "host instrument") or other contracts (the "host contract"). The Association has reviewed all contractual arrangements and have not identified embedded derivatives. The Association has elected to not apply the requirements of Section 3855 for contracts to buy or sell non-financial items, including any derivatives which may be embedded within these contracts.



Notes to Financial Statements (continued)

Significant accounting policies (continued):

(b) Contributed services:

Volunteers assist the Association in carrying out its service delivery activities. Because of the difficulty of determining their fair value, contributed services are not recognized in the financial statements.

(c) Revenue recognition:

The Association follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions. Restricted contributions are recognized as revenue in the year the related expenses are incurred. Unrestricted contributions are recognized as revenue when received or receivable if the amount can be reasonable estimated and collection is reasonably assured. Contributed materials and services are recognized in the financial statements when their fair value is reasonably estimable.

Affiliation and registration fees, programs, courses and fees and interest income are recognized as revenue when earned.

(d) Inventory:

inventory is stated at the lower of cost and net realizable value. Cost is determined on a first-in, first-out basis. Net realizable value is defined as selling price less cost to sell.

(e) Capital assets:

Capital assets are recorded at cost. Capital assets are amortized using the declining balance method at the following annual rates:

Asset	Rate
Office and computer equipment	20 - 30%

(f) Investment in Limited Partnership:

Investment in Limited Partnership is recorded at cost. If the recoverable value of an investment declines below cost and this decline in value is considered to be other than temporary, the investment is written down to recoverable value.



Notes to Financial Statements (continued)

Significant accounting policies (continued):

(q) Risk management and fair value:

The risks that arise from transacting financial instruments include credit risk, liquidity risk, and price risk. Price risk arises from changes in interest rates, foreign currency exchange rates and market prices. The Association does not use derivative financial instruments to after the effects of these risks. The Association manages these risks through the use of prudent risk management policies and practices.

Changes in interest rates and credit ratings are the main cause of change in the fair value of the Association's loans and receivables resulting in a favourable or unfavourable variance compared to book value. Credit risk is mitigated by dealing with counterparties that it believes are creditworthy. Interest rate risk is mitigated by managing maturity dates and payment frequency.

(h) Capital management:

The Association's objectives when managing capital are to safeguard the Association's ability to continue as a going concern so that it can continue to provide service to stakeholders, including its members, to continue to promote amateur swimming in Alberta.

The Association sets out the sufficiency of capital to maintain the service needs of the stakeholders and makes adjustments to its budget to respond to potential changes in economic conditions. In order to maintain a sufficient capital structure, management looks forward to future needs and will recommend increased fees or decrease in program and grant expenditures.

Use of estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the year. Actual results could differ from those estimates.



Notes to Financial Statements (continued)

Significant accounting policies (continued):

(j) Future accounting changes:

The Canadian Institute of Chartered Accountants (CICA) has issued several amendments to not-for-profit accounting standards. Under these amended standards, there will no longer be a requirement to treat net assets invested in capital assets as a separate component of net assets and, instead, permit such an amount as a category of internally restricted net assets when an organization chooses to do so. The amended standards also:

- clarify that revenues and expenses must be recognized and presented on a gross basis when an organization is acting as the principal in the transactions;
- make Section 1540, Cash Flow Statements, applicable;
- make Section 1751, Interim Financial Statements, applicable;
- make Section 3062, Property, Plant and Equipment, applicable unless the organization is eligible to use the scope exemption for smaller entities; and
- provide consistency with other sections of the CICA Handbook with respect to related party transactions and capital assets.

The CICA has also issued a new standard, Section 4470, Disclosure of Allocated Expenses by Not-for-profit Organizations. This Section establishes the disclosure standards for those organizations that choose to classify their expenses by function and allocate expenses from one function to another. These requirements are effective for fiscal years beginning on or after January 1, 2009.

2. Term deposits:

The term deposits mature from July 2009 to August 2009 and bear interest of 0.45% to 0.5%.

3. Loan receivable:

The Association made an advance to the Edmonton Keyano Swim Club. The advance bears interest at 2.5% per annum, is unsecured and is to be repaid in ten \$1,000 installments from September to June each year for three years commencing September 2008 to June 2011.

7. Athlete Development Fund:

By resolution of the annual General Meeting, incremental revenues generated from a \$0.25 increase in the Olympic Bonus fee have been set aside to be utilized towards programs for athlete development on an annual basis.

Commitments:

The Association is committed to provide several annual athletic bursaries of \$1,000 per year up to 2013. The commitment outstanding as of June 30, 2009 is \$84,000 (2008 - \$60,000).

Contributed materials and services:

Accommodation and certain overhead costs incurred in the administration of Swim Alberta Association, borne by the Province of Alberta, are not reasonably estimable and consequently are not reflected in these financial statements.

HIGH PERFORMANCE COACH REPORT

Goal: To improve the performances of Alberta Swimmers in the national and international arenas.

The Alberta swimmers had another great season. The senior international competitions last summer were the 2009 World Championships, the 2009 World University Games, the British Tri-Nations meet, and the 2009 British Gas Grand Prix.

The major meet of the season was the World Championships in Rome. As always the competition was severe and there was a fight for every medal. Because of the improved and somewhat controversial swimming technology at the meet, the world records were falling like never before; more then forty altogether. Canada won three medals, R. Cochrane in 800 Free, bronze medal, and 1500 Free, silver medal, and A. Pierse won silver in the 200 Breast, breaking a world record in the semifinals. Alberta had four swimmers at the meet, Erica Morningstar, Paul Kornfeld, Pascal Wollach (UCSC) and Joel Greenshields (UA). All four contributed to the strong showing of the Canadian team at the meet.

Later in the summer at the British Gas Grand Prix three swimmers representing Alberta clubs were involved in relays that broke world records.

On the domestic level Alberta Clubs showed strength at both that Age-Group and Senior Nationals. At the Age-Group Nationals in Montreal Cascade won the National title and the Men's title and OSC placed sixth over all and won the women's title. On the senior level the University of Calgary Swim Club (UCSC), with many swimmers competing at the World University Games, finished fifth in combined scoring, the UCSC men placed third.

The remainder of the report summarizes major international competitions in which the Alberta swimmers participated, give a short overview of Alberta tour teams, mention technical programs as well as give a brief overlook of the upcoming 2009/2010 season.

International Competitions

Senior International

FINA World Championships, Rome, July 09

As already mentioned more than 40 World records were broken at the World Championships held in Rome. Canada won three medals and broke one world record. Alberta placed four swimmers on the team, Erica Morningstar, Pascal Wollach, Paul Kornfeld (UCSC) and Joel Greenshields (UA). Erica and Pascal help the team to two Canadian records. Erica in the 400 Free Relay and Pascal in the 400 Medley relays. Both relays placed 9th. Joel competed on the 400 and 800 Free relays. Both relays placed just outside the final. In his individual event Joel made it to the semifinals, his first time ever at this level of meet. Paul was the fastest Canadian in the 200 Breast, placing 19th with a personal best

World Student University Games, Belgrade July 09



The FISU Games traditionally gather world-class student-athletes from all over the world. Alberta had a strong contingency at the meet, winning numerous individual medals and strongly contributing to relay medals and a strong team performance. Kevyn Peterson won the only gold medal for Canada in the 400 Free and silver in the 200 Free. Katy Murdoch won a silver medal in the 100 Back. The Canadian 400 Free relay won a bronze medal with Katy Murdoch, Breanna Hendriks, Seanna Mitchell on the relay. The same three women together with Kevyn were bronze in the 800 Free relay. Ray Betuzzi had a great leadoff leg on the 800 Free relay at the meet. The relay placed third, giving Ray his first medal at this level of competition.

<u>Tri – Nations, London, August 09</u>

Swimmers not competing at the World Championships had a great opportunity to take on swimmers from Great Britain and Russia. Canada won the meet. Katy Murdoch won both backstroke events, breaking her first long course Canadian record in the 100 Back. Kevyn Peterson won both 200 and 400 Free. Kayla Voytechek and Richard Hortness swam their best times in their main events, 100 Breast and 100 Free. David Dimitrov and Thomas Jobin were two of the youngest on the team gaining valuable experience for the

British Gas Grand Prix, Leeds, August 09

For the Canadian National team the international summer competitions finished in Britain at the British Gas Grand Prix. The meet was short course, held in Leeds. Alberta had eleven swimmers at the meet. Katy Murdoch, Paul Kornfeld and Joel Greenshields left the meet as relay world record holders. Katy Murdoch was the backstroker on the 400 Medley relay, leading the relay off with the new Commonwealth record. Paul Kornfeld swam breast on the world record relay and Joel Greenshields anchored the 800 Free relay on the world record-breaking relay.

On the individual level Katy won 100 Back, placed second in 200 Back. Paul Kornfeld won all three Breast events, breaking the Commonwealth Game record in the 200 Breast. Hanna Kubas won 50 Back at the meet. Kayla Voytechek won silver in the breaststroke events. Breanna Hendricks, Kevyn Peterson, David Dimitrov, and Kier Maitland finished the season with swims in the final and many best times.

Junior/Youth International 2009 Australian Youth Olympic Festival, January 2009

Alberta had five swimmers traveling to Australia for the 2009 Australian Youth Olympic Festival. Bobbie Mielnichuk (OSC), David Dimitrov (UCSC), Chad Bobrosky, James Kendrick, Karl Wolk (Cascade). The meet was a



great experience for the young team. Chad won gold in the 400 and 1500 Free and silver in the 200 Free. David finished third in both IM events. Bobbie, Karl, James together with Chad and David won numerous medals on the relays.

North American Challenge, Florida, August 2009

As a part of junior development the best Canadian juniors were selected to represent Canada at the North American Challenge. This was the third year in the row for this competition to take place. Canadian team showed very strong performances at the competition. Alberta was represented by Paige Kremer OSC, Lili Margitai EKSC, Adam Maybury CASC, Connor Bayne CASC. The Alberta swimmers on the team competed at their best. To be a part of the first Canadian National team is a great accomplishment and a great stepping-stone to future Canadian National teams.

Australian age Group Nationals, Sydney, April 09

The top age group swimmers were selected to compete at this meet. Natasha Fung, Breadon Newton (OSC), represented Alberta. Chad Bobrosky, Thomas Jobin, Corey Mills (Cascade). For all of them it was a great experience to compete against the best Australians at their age groups. Our swimmers did well at the meet, measuring great against the competition. After the meet the Alberta swimmers had a short training camp at the Miami Swim Club on the Gold Coast, before returning back home.

Swim Alberta Team Tours

Alberta – BC Dual meet, Kamloops April 09

The Alberta – BC dual meet has become an annual event with both provinces bringing their best 14 and under swimmers. Like many times before the meet was held in Kamloops. The excitement of this annual competition is for many swimmers their first time they represent their provincial teams rather then their club teams. A part of this experience is a brief training period before the meet where swimmers from both provinces swim together. The BC team won the competition, with Alberta swimmers having solid performances at the meet.

North South Dual/Camp 11 & 12, Edmonton, April 09

This was the second year initiative involving 65 swimmers who are 11 & 12 years of age. The intent of this dual is to provide a training and racing opportunity and introduce the swimmers to the concepts of provincial teams and provide for many, their first over night trip away from their parents.



US Open, Federal Way, WA, August 2009

A small group of seven swimmers competed at the US Open, giving them the last competition of the season. As always the competition was very strong and the team was challenged to advance to second swims.

Canada Games, Charlottetown, August 09

Every four years Canada Games feature swimmers from across Canada giving them opportunity to excel while representing their provincial teams. The expectation is that the best swimmers will advance to represent Canada at senior international competitions. The 2008 Olympians Joel Greenshields, Erica Morningstar and Jillian Tyler all competed at the 2005 Canada Games. A future will show how many swimmers from this year's Canada Games will make to London in 2012 The summer preparation for the Games involved competing at the Junior British Nationals and a training camp in Majorca in Spain. The extended travel and preparation gave swimmers and coach's ideas about what to expect in the future when traveling with the Canadian senior teams. The meet was held in short course pool, somewhat unusual for this type of competition. Alberta swimmers won thirty-one medals. The able body swimmers won twenty-five medals including three gold medals. The only individual gold came from Deanna Matthews on the 400 IM. Men's 200 and 400 free relays won the other two gold medals. Para-swimmers won six medals with Zack McAllister capturing gold. The Albert team placed 4th behind Ontario, BC and Quebec.

Technical program

On the technical side, Swim Alberta continued with several established programs from the previous years.

Provincial Stroke Camps

The camps program has been successfully running for several years, impacting a large number of swimmers. The structure of the camps helps the province to influence selected swimmers and enable the stroke coaches, swimmers and personal coaches work together. All personal coaches are encouraged to attend the camps. It is my feeling that personal coaches' participation is a crucial step toward the success of the provincial camp model. Thanks to everyone involved at the camps, being part of Swim Alberta development

This season Swim Alberta refined the provincial stroke structure. There were two camps in October, Fort McMurray and Calgary and two camps in May, Medicine Hat and Edmonton. Each camp ran from Friday to Sunday with three event categories together in each location. Selected swimmers



and coaches traveled to the camp in their region. A designated camp head coach, who is helped by a chaperone, directs each camp.

Calgary/Edmonton City Workouts

The City of Edmonton and the City of Calgary workouts became sessions where the best swimmers from each region were able to train together. In Calgary there were three workouts through the season, supported by UCSC, Cascade and Calgary Patriots. In Edmonton there were four workouts through the season attended by EKSC, OSC, University of Alberta and Silver Tide.

Future programs

In the 2009 - 2010 the Canadian senior teams will compete at the 2010 Pan Pacific Championships in Irvine, CA and the 2010 Commonwealth Games in Delhi, India. The Junior and Youth Team will compete the Victoria and NSW State Championships in Sydney in December 2009 and the Junior Pan Pacific Games in Hawaii in August 2010. I am confident that our province will have swimmers representing Canada at these meets.

At the end I would like to thank all the coaches, officials, parents, and all other supporters who made this season's successes possible.

PROGRAM OFFICER'S REPORT



The position of technical officer delivers the technical program for the Alberta Coaches Council and Swim Alberta. The duties include rankings, stroke camps, tour teams, provincial meets and coach education.

Youth Recognition

During the short course season a total of 146 athletes were recognized with the youth recognition award. There were 27 swimmers aged 10 and under who achieved the top 5 award. In the 11-17 year old age groups there were 17 individuals achieving the top 1 recognition and 51 achieving both the top 10 and top 25 times. The long course season saw even more individuals achieving these awards with 159 total recipients. The 10 and under category had a total of 30 recognized swimmers. The 11-17 year olds saw 30 individuals achieve top 1 standing while 56 and 53 made the top 10 and top 25 awards respectively.

Camps

Over 120 swimmers attended provincial stroke camps during the 2009-2010 season. Camps were held in Fort McMurray, Medicine Hat, Calgary and Edmonton. In addition to swim training the groups received nutrition education and other team building activities.

Tour Teams

Alberta North versus South

56 swimmers aged 11-12 attended the event held at NAIT in Edmonton. The event included flexibility training; two pool training sessions, the dual meet, a session on Swim Alberta programs and a motivational session and autograph session with world championships silver medalist Mike Brown.

Alberta versus BC dual

31 swimmers aged 13-14 attended the dual in Kamloops. The participants had six pool training sessions and heard world record holder Annamay Pierse speak about her Olympic and world record breaking experiences.

Canada Games Team

32 swimmers attended the Canada Games held in Charlottetown, PEI for the Canada Games. 24 swimmers attended the British Youth Nationals and trained in Palma de Mallorca, Spain before meeting with the rest of the team in Montreal for one week prior to the games. The results included 13 provincial records and a total of 31 medals. (4 gold, 13 silver and 14 bronze)

Over the past few years we have had some difficulty finding a time to hold an officials meeting in the province that would work for officials in all regions. Thus this past year we started producing the **Alberta Officials Newsletter** and distributing the



document to all provincial officials via email. Our intention is to continue this avenue as a means to provide current information to our officials. Additionally this past season we held meetings in Edmonton and Calgary; inviting club presidents and official's chairs as a means of imparting updated information and providing a forum to discuss issues of concerns. The meetings were well received and we intend to schedule these meetings for the 2009-2010 swim season.

The AOC are proud to announce the **SWIM ALBERTA TRAVEL PROGRAM** effective for the 2009-2010 swim season. Officials who are interested in accessing funds to promote their officiating career are asked to review the information on the Swim Alberta web site and submit completed applications to the Chair of the AOC.

Many of you are aware of the controversy surrounding the new swimsuits. Please take note of the new regulations that are now in effect and have been agreed to by all the provinces and Swimming Canada. The new rule was circulated to all clubs and coaches in mid September and posted on the Swim Alberta website. Please note that **one suit only** is to be worn for all competitions.

OFFICIALS DECK ATTIRE: This past season Swim Alberta moved to the use of navy blue shirt. The new colour should be worn at all Alberta meets. Please note shirts should be worn with **WHITE** pants, skirt, crop pants, knee length shorts or full length pants. We ask the official's chairs to promote the use of the appropriate colours.

Official's Education: The AOC is continuing their goal of providing online education to all officials. Most clinics will soon be available as a power point presentation. Development of a strong mentorship program is one of our goals for the coming season. The SNC technical committee and National Officials Committee are making strides in the development of a standardized teaching program for Canadian Officials. We strongly encourage officials planning on further education to contact their AOC member for guidance on course selection.

- 5. Alberta A/G / Senior Champs. LC, Host OSC, Edmonton 1 4 July 2010

These clubs have all committed to hosting these meets under the conditions set down by the Province and are able to provide the requirements set down under the conditions of hosting. A total of five (5) clubs submitted bids for these meets, and all five were given the opportunity to host one of their preferred selections. Due to the facility renovations in Calgary for the following year, no bids were received from any major club in that city.

The annual Meet Calendar was also approved for publication on the Swim Alberta site. This year there were fewer meet date conflicts to deal with, but any that did appear were dealt with and settled to every ones satisfaction.
