## Chairman and Executive Director Message

With the start of a new swim season ahead of us, we can look back on the 2013 – 2014 year to celebrate the many achievements of our athletes, coaches, clubs and Swim Alberta as an organization.

Swim Alberta is in its second year of a four year strategic plan, that saw the organization continue to press forward with strategies and identified outcomes to ensure we are able to meet our mandate of providing innovative and world-class athlete development and high performance competitive swimming programs.

Although 2013 – 2014 saw the closing of a national swim centre in Calgary, it allowed us to begin the strategic conversations of how we will begin to move forward with high-performance swimming in the province. With a renewed commitment from the large clubs and the High Performance Advisory Committee of Swim Alberta, 2014 – 2015 will see us lay out a strategy that will ensure we are well positioned for the future and remain competitive on both the national and more importantly the world stage.

Our athletes continued to perform and represent Alberta well on the national and international stages, making many junior and senior national teams. In total we placed 26 athletes on senior national and junior national teams with representation at the Commonwealth Games, Pan Pacific Swimming Championships, Junior Pan Pacs, Australian Age Group and Junior Tours.

The Alberta Coaches Council (ACC) worked to review and adopt a new terms of reference for both the ACC as well as the High Performance Advisory Council (HPAC) to ensure that the work the two committees were doing remained relevant and able to influence the direction of swimming in the province of Alberta.

Our registration numbers in the sport of swimming in Alberta continue to grow. Registrations of year round swimmers, summer swimmers, varsity swimmers and masters swimmers totaled 9300 in the 2013 -2014 season, an increase of 125 swimmers from the previous season with the biggest growth in our development and age group areas.

Swim Alberta remains committed to ensuring that we have effective programs and services for our athletes, coaches, clubs and officials. 2013 – 2014 saw the organization hire two new growth positions. A Head Provincial Coach (Mark Perry) to enable Swim Alberta to continue to build upon the strengths that exist in our development and age group programs as well as being able to seek out new opportunities to create and define a go-forward plan for high performance swimming in the province.

Swim Alberta also established a Club Development Director (Sureen Gosal) to assist clubs throughout the province in putting into place effective club structures that will support the development of our athletes, coaches and officials.

Swim Alberta worked in partnership with Swimming Canada over the course of the last year to successfully implement the new online platform of the national Swim a Thon program. Clubs found the online platform easier to administer and most saw an increase in the amount of donations collected. We will continue to work with Swimming Canada and our Alberta clubs in order that this continues to be a viable and successful fundraising program for our clubs.

Swim Alberta has worked closely with Lloyd Sadd Insurance Brokers Ltd over the 2013 – 2014 season to develop guidelines and policies to assist clubs in understanding the insurance program offered through Swim Alberta and also to streamline some of the processes and requirements to make it easier for clubs in regards to the insurance program.

Over the course of this past year Swim Alberta and the Alberta Summer Swimming Association formalized the affiliation agreement that existed between the two organizations for more than two decades. The two organizations also worked to establish a formal service agreement in order that Swim Alberta can provide the office support to the Alberta Summer Swimming Association in running their organization.

The board of Swim Alberta completed a review of the 2011 bylaws and has made recommendations for bylaw changes to the membership that will allow Swim Alberta to follow best practices around organizational governance. The board continues to review and ensure policies are current and relevant for the organization. This past year saw the updating and creation of Discipline and Complaints Policy; Membership Policy and Special Interest Group Membership Policy.

On behalf of Swim Alberta, thank you to the board of directors, staff, athletes coaches parents and officials for the continues contribution you make to the sport of swimming and the swimming community. We look forward to another year of success and growth in 2014 – 2015 and to continue to work in partnership with all of you.

### HIGH PERFORMANCE SWIMMING

Swim Alberta has been well represented internationally during the past season having had swimmers selected for Swimming Canada at every level of event.

#### Senior Swimming Team representations

The senior level featured two major competitions this season and Alberta had great representation at both the Commonwealth Games in Glasgow, Scotland and The Pan Pacific Championships on the Gold Coast, Australia.

#### Para Swimming Team representations

The two major Para Swimming competitions of the season, The Commonwealth Games and Pan Pacific Championships both featured swimmers from Alberta.

#### **Para Pan Pac**

Morgan Bird (Cascade) came home with an amazing four-medal haul, winning silver in the 50 free and three bronze medals in the 100 free and both the freestyle and medley relays. Also representing the University of Calgary was Christian Daniel.

#### Domestic Competitions

On the domestic level, Alberta clubs showed strength at the Canadian Age Group Championships and Summer Nationals.

The Edmonton Keyano Swim Club took home two team championship titles at the 2014 Canadian Swimming Championships at the Shaw Centre in Saskatoon. Winning the combined team championship and the Women's team championship title. Alberta had three teams in the top 10 combined scores – University of Calgary Swim Club (7th overall) and Cascade Swim Club (10th overall).

Canadian Age Group Championships saw three teams from Alberta finish in the top ten: The University of Calgary Swim Club in 7th, followed by Olympian Swim Club in 8th and Edmonton Keyano Swim Club taking the 10th place spot.



## PROVINCIAL PROGRAMS

### Alberta Summer Games

192 swimmers at the Alberta Summer Games held in Airdrie, AB. The event was on the same weekend as the Canadian Age Group Championships. Two swimmers earned new Canadian Age Group Championships standards. There were a record 11 Special Olympics and Para swimmers competing. The zone title came down to the final relay. Congratulations to Zone 3 (Calgary) who narrowly beat defending champions Zone 3 at the games. Zone 3 displayed great class lining up to shake hands with the new zone champions.

### Youth Recognition

During the short course season a total of 144 athletes were recognized with the youth recognition award. There were 20 swimmers aged 10 and under who achieved the Top 5 award. In the 11-17 year old age groups there were 8 individuals achieving Top 1 recognition, 51 achieved Top 10 and 65 earned the Top 25 award. The long course season had a total of 152 total recipients. The 10 and under category had a total of 24 recognized swimmers. The 11-17 year olds saw 7 individuals achieve Top 1 standing while 50 and 71 made the Top 10 and Top 25 awards respectively.

### Fall Stroke Camp

The top 32 ranked swimmers aged 13-16 in the province participated in the Lethbridge camp October 4-6, 2013. Swimmers were taught by the provincial stroke coaches and received nutrition education.

### Para Swimming Camp

On November 8-10, 2013 Swim Alberta held its annual Para Camp held in partnership with the Steadward Centre at the University of Alberta. Sixteen swimmers and four coaches attended the camp, which was run by Janet Dunn, Swimming Canada's Para Swimming Development Coach.

### Alberta North versus South Tour Team

Forty-eight swimmers aged 11-13 qualified to attend the event held at Kinsmen in Edmonton. All swimmers attended with at least one coach from their club. The event provides both swimmer and coach education. The event included dry land training; two pool training sessions and the dual meet.

### Prospects West

Alberta sent 24 swimmers and four coaches to attend the annual Prospects West camp in Saskatoon. The event is a joint camp with British Columbia and a combined team from Manitoba & Saskatchewan. The participants had seven-pool training sessions, a competition plus video analysis and other education sessions.

## PROVINCIAL CHAMPIONSHIP COMPETITIONS

A new time standard process was set for the 2013-2014 season, which resulted in faster A standards. The Age Group Trials competitions saw increased numbers in both North and South and the regionals format was extended to the Long Course season. Senior swimmers had the opportunity to participate in the new Alberta Open series of meets.

- Regional Trials Short Course: 637 swimmers (235 North / 402 South), 67 new A qualifiers
- Age Group Championships Short Course: 441 swimmers
- Regional Trials Long Course: 505 swimmers (158 North / 347 South), 58 new A qualifiers
- Alberta Open 1: 332 swimmers
- Alberta Open 2: 284 swimmers
- Age Group / Senior Championships Long Course: 720 swimmers (440 Age Group / 280 Senior)

## COACH EDUCATION

Over the past year ten Swim 101 courses ran with 157 participants towards their first level of certification. One Swim 201 course was delivered to a total of 10 participants.

## COMMITTEE AND REGION REPORTS

### Alberta Coaches Council (ACC)

The Alberta Coaches Council is elected by the coach membership in Alberta. The ACC provides the direction for the format of the provincial meets, tour teams, stroke camps and funding programs. The ACC endeavors to provide coach education and mentorship opportunities to the coaches of Alberta. During the past year one of the significant changes was the approval of a new time standards process. The new standard allowed the expansion of regional Age Group Trials to both short course and long course seasons, exposing more swimmers to provincial competition. For the 2014-2015 season the ACC has approved a new process for the youth recognition awards, moving to single year standards, which align to the provincial records format. During the next season the ACC will work with Mark Perry, the new Swim Alberta Provincial Coach, to review the technical program and meet format.





## **Competition Review Committee (CRC)**

The role of the Competition Review Committee is to develop the provincial competition guidelines and approve the competition schedule. During the past year the committee developed a standard criteria and application process for clubs to host provincial meets. The CRC received a record 10 applications to host provincial meets for the 2014-2015 season.

## **Alberta Officials Committee (AOC)**

The Alberta Officials Committee (AOC) is responsible for the development of swimming officials at all levels in Alberta and the North West Territories. This includes year round swimming, Alberta Summer Swimming Association, Para swimming, and Masters Swimming. A number of clinics were offered throughout the province during the 2013 – 2014 season both through clubs and the regional clinic days. With the implementation of the new 2013 Canadian and FINA rulebook, the Alberta Officials Committee also worked to update all clinics to align with the new rules.

## **Alberta Masters Swimming**

The Alberta Masters Swimming Committee is an operational and technical committee of Swim Alberta, which works with swimmers who are 18 years of age, or older and are all members of Masters Swimming Canada, Swimming Canada and Swim Alberta. The Alberta Marlin Aquatic Club ran a very successful provincial championship masters meet in April of 2014. In 2013 – 2014 there were just over 900 masters swimmers in Alberta.

## **Swim Alberta – Southern Region and Swim Alberta – Northern Region**

Both regions continue to provide ongoing support to Swim Alberta and the area clubs through a coordination of officials clinics, coach funding programs and athlete funding programs. Southern Region continues to offer a strong Junior Circuit program and Northern Region was awarded the 2014 Can Ams Swimming Championships in December 2014. The regions are working closely with Swim Alberta to further define their mandates as well as programs and services to support the effective development of our coaches, athletes and officials.
