OFFICIALS SELF-DIRECTED CLINICS

Self-Directed Clinics are offered to officials in lieu of instructor lead clinics. The difference between self-directed clinics and instructor lead clinics is in instructor lead clinics officials have the opportunity to ask questions and participate in discussions. With self-directed you do not have this opportunity that is why self-directed clinics must be followed up with a mentorship with a certified official in that clinic before your first deck evaluation. Mentorships are recorded by your club and not on the Swimming Canada system.

A certified official is an official who has taken the clinic, completed both evaluations and feels comfortable/experienced in the role to mentor others. The officials can be from in or out of your club.

Self-Directed Clinics are only offered if they are not offered on the Swimming Canada Learning Management System. To take a self-directed clinic select the clinic from the list on swimalberta.ca/officials/clinics/ Fill out the self-directed clinic Online Clinic Reporting Form.

Forms must be completed no later than 1 week after completion of clinic. You may only take one Level II clinic between competitions to allow for deck experience before taking the next clinic, with the exception of the Recorder-Scorer clinic as no certification is needed for this position. Please make sure your deck log is up to date at all times.

Once your clinic form is sent in, please allow up to 2 business days to receive a confirmation. At that time your Club Officials Administrator will be informed that mentorship is needed and Swim Alberta will update your Swimming Canada profile.
